An Excerpt from Martin Luther

“Thus He compares here the unjust to the just. As the unjust man acts shrewdly, though wrongly and like a rogue, so we also should act shrewdly but righteously in godliness. This is the proper understanding of this parable. For the Lord says: ‘The children of this world are wiser than the children of light.’ So that the children of light should learn wisdom from the children of darkness or the world. Just as they are wise in their transactions, so should also the children of light be wise in their transactions. Therefore He adds, ‘in their generation.’” *From Martin Luther’s sermon from the Church Postil for the Ninth Sunday after Trinity Sunday.*
