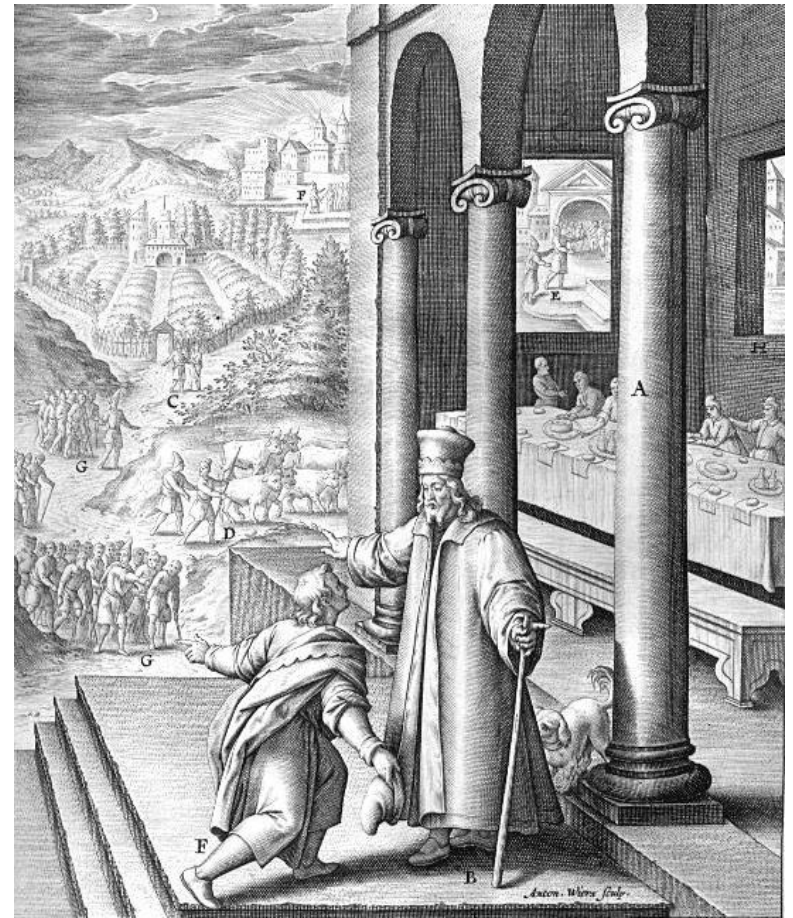
#### **A Prayer after Communion**

Apostles were all sent forth with one and the same word into all the world, to bid and call to this supper with one voice and with one Gospel, or with one message. Thus, when St. Peter arrived at and preached in a place where St. Paul had preached before, it was the same teaching which the one preached as the other, and the hearers also could say: Behold, he preaches just like we heard before from the first one; they agree and are one and the same. In order to show this unity, the Evangelist says: ‘And he sent forth his servant,’ and says not, his servants, as if he spake of many servants. But the message, the servant should execute and with which he should gain recruits, was: ‘Come; for all things are now ready.’” *From Martin Luther’s Sermon in the Church Postil for the Second Sunday after Trinity Sunday, 1523.*

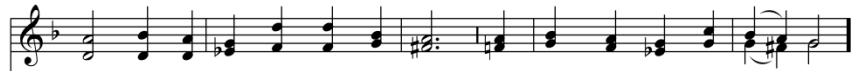
